Charitable Deductions and the New Tax Law

In a previous Dove, mention was made of a method to make a charitable contribution to our church that was advantageous when considering the limitations included in the new tax law. This involves using funds you are required to withdraw from an IRA, known as Required Minimum Distributions. The distributions are called Qualified Charitable Distributions, or QCDs, and are direct transfers from your IRA to the charity,

Briefly, this allows the amount distributed to the charity to be excluded from your Adjusted Gross Income; that amount cannot be included in your itemized deductions, but in many cases, this is to your advantage if you can only take the standard deduction.


