Message From Pastor Brad

You Can't Rush the Crops

"But the landowner said, 'No, because if you gather the weeds, you'll pull up the wheat along with them. Let both grow side by side until the harvest. And at harvest time I'll say to the harvesters, "First gather the weeds and tie them together in bundles to be burned. But bring the wheat into my barn."" - Matthew 13:29-30 (CEB)

At any point in your professional life, were you ever faced with any abstract questions about your life? A common one is something to the effect of, "Where do you see yourself in 5 (or 10) years from now?" This kind of thinking has been on my mind because every summer I get to answer some questions like that in the form I get to fill out for my annual supervisory interview with the District Superintendent. I must admit, these usually aren't my favorite things to dwell upon, but God has done a wondrous thing by combining this kind of broad thinking with Jesus' parable about the wheat and the weeds. This parable has stuck with me since preparing for that sermon because I keep coming back to what it means to be part of the wheat.

As I said in my message that Sunday, in the past whenever I had come across this parable I couldn't help but focus in on the ending. That is a profound message and, depending on where you stand with the Lord, either a powerful affirmation or a serious warning. I've learned to value the image of planting and crops even more because they are things that cannot be rushed. You can't rush to the end, as I often have, because there is a lot of work, care, and waiting that comes before the harvest. In Jesus' explanation of this parable we as followers of Christ are identified as the wheat, and the "followers of the evil one" are the weeds (13:38). Be that as it may, the one who planted the good seeds, which Christ

identifies as the Son of Man in verse 37, declares that the wheat and the weeds are going to grow up together.

In the parable, the Master tells his servants, after they ask if the weeds should be pulled up, to leave them be because it would put the wheat at risk. What does that say to you about how much God loves and values us? Mercy is chosen over judgment in that moment so that the harvest can be as full as possible without any casualties. At the end of the parable Jesus says that there are going to still be some weeds that will be tossed into the fire, but the rest of the harvest will be brought into the storehouse. To see the hope in this we must temporarily abandon the plant imagery, because we all know a weed can't be turned into something beautiful or beneficial no matter how much love and care is put into it. But isn't that exactly what Christ offers and does for every one of us?

Some of us may have lived like a weed, not doing much good for ourselves or others. Or maybe we were part of the crop, we knew Christ and believed, but maybe we weren't bearing all the fruit we could. Regardless, we can all claim our place in the wondrous harvest to come and grow into something beyond our wildest hopes and dreams thanks to the redemption and salvation that can only come from Christ. The harvest is coming, we don't know when and we certainly can't rush it along, but we can all take the time we have left to be deepen our roots in the Lord, grow into the Spirit, and hopefully lead some weeds into being transformed by Christ along the way.

Home Communion & Visitations

It is Pastor Brad's hope and vision to expand the caring and visitation ministries of our church beyond him to include as many laypeople from our church as are willing. Some members of our church expressed their interest in doing this some time ago, but we are going to make a more concerted effort to train and send out the laypeople of our church to provide home visits for communion, prayer, and fellowship. If you feel led to participate in this ministry, please let Pastor Brad know by e-mail or written note also. There will be a training and orientation time for this later in August, so stay tuned!

How Are We Feeling Now— (Financially) A Mid-Year Checkup

Well, here we are seven months into our financial year. It has been a bit of a roller coaster ride, starting out high, then a big swoop down, and at the end of May, climbing back up again. All I can say now is GOD IS GOOD ALL THE TIME!!

In my last Dove article on finance, I chastised myself for not having faith that if we prayed about our concerns, God would make His will known to us. I believe with all my heart that He has touched our church family, and brought new brothers and sisters in Christ through our doors, to strengthen our ministry at Millville.

The result, after the third week in July, is this: our worship giving now **exceeds** our budget estimate by almost \$6,000!! Furthermore, our actual expenses are under our budget estimate by about \$2,000.

So does that mean we can stop praying? Absolutely not. And does that mean we can put a little less in the offering plate? I was warned that if I made our church family aware of our situation, that might happen. Knowing the generosity you have shown over the years, I have faith that will never happen.

When the finance committee meets again in September, my recommendation will be that we revisit a budget that we discarded early in the year due to our concerns. We will consider acting on some unfunded plans, but most importantly, consider moving funds into two areas: (1) paying down the mortgage, and (2) our capital reserve account.

A few months ago, the finance committee recommended that we move the remainder in our building fund to a capital reserve fund, as a source of funds for emergent major repairs. Given the age of our physical plant, this is an absolute necessity, and building it up is a priority we can't ignore.

Again, I thank you for your prayers, and your generosity. You are an amazing church family, and I know I am thankful to be a part of it. Rich Spina, Finance Chairman

Wesley Hall Mortgage Monthly Status Let's Pay it Down!!

We made a pretty good dent in our mortgage balance so far during July by applying the proceeds from the yard sale. Due to the outstanding efforts of Kathy and Brice Cropper and their dedicated team of yard sale workers, we were able to reduce the mortgage by at least \$4,000, so I expect our balance at the end of July to be close to \$131,000.

Our current loan will come due in about four years. At that time we will be faced with renegotiating for a new loan, probably at an interest

rate greater than the 5.47% rate we currently hold. We are now paying about \$641/month in interest.

You can help reduce the mortgage balance and avoid interest in several ways: by special donation using a pew envelope, or by placing your donation in a basket at the rear of the sanctuary marked "Mortgage Reduction." Thank you in advance for your support.


Cookie Bingo
