God Among Us

I have a confession to make. I had no idea what to write for this article three hours before I started it. One of my greatest professional fears is being repetitive, either in the sermons I give on or when I write to you all in things like this. I reassure myself often that everyone who is in attendance is listening attentively, retains every word I say and buries them deep in their brains. We won't consider the varying levels of awake people may be and how I may sometimes talk longer than the average attention span. Unlike my sermons this is written down, and I realize that if you save them you can go back and re-read them.

Anyway, my anxieties around all of this get a little more heightened around Christmas and Easter, because those are the biggest days in the church year and you can ask anyone on the street, even if they haven't been in a church in decades, and they'll be able to give you some kind of summary of what goes on. How do you say something new about a story the whole world knows, and that many people revisit at least once a year for their whole lives? God blessed me with relief from my writer's block and gave me early reassurance to these seasonal woes through visiting a homebound member of the church.

I have known for a few years now that if I am feeling down, stressed, or even questioning the worth of what I am doing all I need to do is go visit someone and I am cured and put back on track. This experience, and the subsequent feelings from it, are already redefining and deepening my feelings about Christmas for me. In John 1:14 we hear the familiar words that, "the word became flesh and made his dwelling among us" (NIV). It's that last part that I find particularly moving as I prepare for Advent and Christmas. Take a moment and think about what

that means. We aren't expectantly awaiting a fix to a problem, a divine solution delivered from on high, God to just snap God's fingers and make it all better. After we are done giving thanks with our loved ones, we await the Lord delivering us Himself to us. To make Himself like us; in our family, our community, and in our human experience.

God has made his dwelling among us because our Father and Creator desires to be in loving relationship with us. If your TV breaks or a kitchen appliance goes on the fritz, you either put it in the care of someone you may or may not know to fix or you replace it with a new one, putting the old one out to pasture. Like any good and loving parent, God tried every which way to lead His children to live healthy and loving lives and when that didn't work He got right in the mix of it and got hands on.

In putting Himself in our midst, Jesus could look directly in our eyes, speak to us face to face, and physically invite us into what life can be. Later on, in John's gospel we hear Jesus say, "I am the vine, you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5, NIV). Through the Incarnation we can read and hear, time and time again, about our Creator God who loved us His wayward and lost children so much that He wasn't willing to write us off and leave us to our own means. God came to lead us back to Himself, in His Spirit providing us with what we need step by step along the way. In the weeks ahead, we prepare ourselves to make and recommit to this lifelong journey once again of leading others while being led by Jesus Christ all the way home.

Our Financial Health: ...With Thanks to God

Once again, we are approaching the end of the year, praising God for his blessing, and your generosity. As of November 18th, worship giving is almost \$12,000 greater than our budget estimate for 2018.

We are truly blessed by a dedicated and generous church family.

Our General Fund balance at the end of October is still trending up. I am confident that the balance will be over to \$40,000 at the end of the year. The Finance Committee will be meeting in early December to determine end-of-year actions to transfer funds to the capital reserve account, and make a supplemental payment against the mortgage, as we did in 2017. It has also been suggested that we apply some of the undesignated funds in the memorial account (\$14,800) to mortgage reduction.

We believe it would be prudent to go into 2019, with a general fund balance of between \$25,000 and \$30,000, so our end-of-year actions will reflect that plan.

We are still considering ways to have the mortgage paid off by the time the current note comes due in January, 2021, including a "Burn-the-Mortgage" drive. If you have any thoughts on how to make the drive as effective as possible, please contact a member of the Finance Committee.

Therefore, the Trustees, and other members of our church family who have knowledge of protection issues will consider what steps we should take to increase safety in our facilities. We will keep our members informed as we work through this issue.
