MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BRAD

Be Kind...

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law."

- Galatians 5:22-23, NIV

One morning, some time ago, I was listening to a radio show and they stumbled upon the topic of slogans and catchphrases that no longer exist, or are on the brink of disappearing. Most of it just came off as silly talk-show nonsense, but I actually had an emotional reaction when they got to Be Kind, Rewind. Those three words immediately took me back to countless special memories from my childhood that involved movies, especially VHS tapes.

I remember the first time I watched Star Wars when I found a copy of it at my aunt and uncle's house in Florida. I remember how my parents bought me a copy of Batman Returns for the only surgery I've ever had (I was 8), and stuck it in my bed as they wheeled me into the operating room. All of those experiences ended with me hearing the phrase, Be Kind, Rewind in my head and following suit. It was done either out of kindness to myself or others. There were few things worse as a kid than wanting to watch a movie and needing to wait that agonizing minute or two for it to rewind. I didn't want to impose that on myself or anyone else.

It may sound silly, but I believe we can treat what Be Kind, Rewind stands for as a modern day parable about how God relates to us and what we are called to do about it.

What would your definition of kindness be? How do you think about it, or use it? What does it mean to be kind? In Jeremiah 31:3 we hear these words, "The Lord appeared to us in the past, saying: "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness" (NIV). Kindness isn't a word to be thrown around lightly, or a general state of being. We often think of kindness as simply the opposite, or absence of some form of meanness or negativity. I often use kindness to describe someone who seems gentle or compassionate, even if there isn't much action or evidence to prove it. The kindness we find in Galatians and Jeremiah isn't so simple, we hear that it is a result of God's everlasting love. One is poured out upon us as the other unceasingly draws us in.

Look at your own life, especially as you try to live according to the teachings of Christ. How do you embody the phrase, "Be Kind..." in your daily life? How would people finish the phrase about you? We all receive and know the unyielding kindness of the Lord, but how do we share it or pass it on to others? In the same way we would always rewind the video for the next person out of courtesy, we are called to pass on the kindness of Christ in whatever way we can. Make it something big, or something small and wonderful. Most of all make it something that reveals the Lord at work in your life and reaching out to connect all. In 1 Samuel 20:14 we hear this plea, "But show me unfailing kindness like the Lord's kindness as long as I live" (NIV). Through

the work of the Spirit in us, may we transcend niceness and go beyond simply being not mean, but live out this verse with all our being.

Trustees Report

The Trustees committee has undergone some changes for 2017. We welcome Phyllis Rudd (who agreed to another term), Sheila Herman, and Frank Lathbury. Joe Skinner, who has provided extraordinary leadership in so many areas, is stepping down as chairman but will continue on the committee. I will attempt to maintain the high leadership standard Joe has set, but those are big shoes to fill.

We have been truly blessed to have gotten through 2016 without any major issue with respect our physical plant. Unfortunately, we started 2017 with the sanctuary oil furnace shutting down on January 28th, causing us to move our Sunday service to Wesley Hall. However, the problem was easy to diagnose and repair at minimal cost, so we are back to the sanctuary on February 5th.

As with many of our church's systems, and like ourselves, age has a way of sneaking up on you and causing some aches and pains. The furnace is over 12 years old and although still working fairly well will not last forever. Other components are even older, some going back to original construction 110 years ago. The Trustees are dedicated to preserving our beloved old church, and will do our best to keep it going as the "Lighthouse on the Corner".

For 2017, the Trustees are considering a number of projects:

• Sanctuary handicapped ramp—the ramp has a number of issues, not the least of which is age deterioration. In winter, it is difficult to keep the walkway safe after snow/ice since it gets no sun. De-icing material does not work well. Railings are prone to splinters. Alternatives are (1) to replace the ramp in another sunny location (along the west side of the sanctuary) with synthetic materials, (2) rebuild at the same location with synthetic materials and a system to keep it clear of snow/ice. Both are quite expensive, and only cost estimates will be prepared this year due to funding constraints.

- Sanctuary audio/visual system and special event lighting—the current video system performance is marginal in terms of clarity and observation from the pulpit area. Improvements would include using better wiring to transmit images, new technology projector, and additional monitors to enable viewing by the choir and pastor. Microphones would be upgraded to reduce background noise interference and response. Directed lighting would support special events in the altar area. The use of largescreen TV in place of current projector/wall screen will be considered. We are in the process of getting an estimate, and will make a recommendation to the Administrative council.
- Other minor projects include replacing some deteriorating exterior doors (under warranty) in Wesley Hall, creating a plaque to recognize those who made special donations to the sanctuary lighting.
