Clean Your Interior

I've realized in my almost 8 years of preaching regularly and writing articles for the church on a regular basis that there are certain trains of thought I can very easily fall into on a routine basis. As I was about to sit down and use this month's Dove to pick on how most people have abandoned their resolutions by now anyway I realized that was a path I've already gone down anyway. God used that minor revelation to give me a greater realization about how the world works and how we as the church need to go the other way, all thanks to these pesky resolutions.

I now know why I don't like New Year's resolutions. They're too surface-level and based on us trying to do or act our way into being someone else. It's all about works, and if you're curious about what the Bible says about works take a look at the Book of James and what Jesus said about how to pray. Many people say they're going to eat more or this or less than that, when their goal should be to be a healthier person overall. Many people may say they are going to read more or take a class or something, but imagine if their goal was to be more curious and committed to learning? Maybe you've heard someone say they are going to be more sociable and go out more in the new year when they are really looking for closer relationships, not simply being around other people.

Being a follower of Christ is first and foremost about interior work. It's what God is most concerned with and we should follow suit. The exterior, for us and how we relate to others, is a byproduct and secondary to what's going on inside of us. I can get a bright new coat of paint put on my van, but that won't change the fact that my engine is Skinny you, bigger, you, social you, more read you, the you that goes to things or doesn't. If God isn't at work in your heart and changing your life how you look and where you are doesn't matter. I'm reminded of the story of the rich young ruler, which can be found in Mark 10:17-27. This wealthy young person comes to Christ asking what he needs to do to, "inherit eternal life" (10:17). Jesus tells the young man to go sell all of his possessions and give the money to the poor. We read that when he heard this, "the man's face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth" (10:22). This guy was willing to pay a price to attain this prize of eternal life because he had money to spare.

Thankfully and obviously, Jesus was wise to his game. When the young man was confronted with Jesus' challenge to change who he was, and not just make an easy sacrifice, he left empty handed. In this new year, I do hope we all continue to strive for greater health and discipline in our physical, spiritual, mental, and emotional lives individually and as a church. Doing is important, but we are called not only to do and say like Christ, but to take on the likeness of Christ in all our ways. It's more than a resolution, it's a covenant we've made and in God's mercy, He lets us renew it often and turn to Him for everything we need to get there. May we all be God's obedient children ready to receive the blessings the Lord has in store for us this year.

This is a collection of daily devotional readings, which are relatively short, and daily prayers for the whole year. This book also includes a list of the lectionary readings for the year, a guide to daily prayer, and examples of prayers to use throughout your day.

<u>A Disciple's Journal 2018: A Guide for Daily</u> <u>Prayer, Bible Reading, and Discipleship</u> by Steven W. Manskar

This book is written and edited by a United Methodist pastor who works for our denomination's Discipleship Ministries. He is also an expert on covenant discipleship, which is a small group ministry and guide for individual faith based on how Wesley practiced and organized the early Methodist movement. This book provides Scripture readings for every day, selections from John Wesley's writings, hymns from Charles Wesley, individual prayers, and a variety of articles and guides on Methodism, covenant discipleship, and Methodist doctrine.

Draw the Circle: The 40 Day Prayer Challenge by Mark Batterson

This book is familiar to many of you since we engaged in the 40 Day Prayer Challenge as a church last year. Our Financial Health:A Good Start For 2018

Even after we missed the first Sunday of the new year because of snow, we are still almost at our estimated worship giving level, with the year-to date actual giving at \$8,565 compared to \$8,998 budgeted. We finished 2017 with a general fund balance of \$37,387, about \$4,000 more than we anticipated. The Finance Committee will be meeting on February 12th to consider an additional supplemental payment on the mortgage, and adding to our capital reserve fund.

Our budget for 2018 is \$155,970, so if the Lord continues to inspire your generosity, we should be in good condition to carry out our mission.

For 2017, we reduced our mortgage balance from \$145,277.74 to \$117,099.66. This was very encouraging as we continue our effort to pay off the mortgage by the end of 2019. Hopefully (and prayerfully) we will see the same generosity in 2018, and beyond. Some of our members have made special donations to reduce the mortgage balance for a substantial savings in interest paid. You can do the same in several ways: by using a pew envelope, or by placing your donation in a basket at the rear of the sanctuary marked "Mortgage Reduction." Some of our members have made a special donation in honor of, or in memory of someone special in their lives. Thank you in advance for your support.
