Message From Pastor Brad

Happy (Cough) New Year

As many of you heard the Sunday after Christmas, I found myself pretty sick just in time for New Year's Eve. It wasn't the best time for me, because of all the obvious reasons. I can't help but shake my head at myself because I have the remarkable knack for getting so sick that I can barely talk on the one day of the week I have to. All of that notwithstanding, it was oddly liberating and comforting to be in the condition I was at the end of the year. As we all know, countless people take the start of the year as an opportunity and motivation for changing their ways and starting anew.

Did you make any resolutions this year? I sure didn't. I probably wouldn't have even I was totally healthy. Those never last too long into the year for me. Whenever people bring up new year's resolutions I tell them about the year Erin and I decided to join a gym. We gave it a good go, but our time as gym people ultimately lasted about as long as you'd expect. Now whenever I think of new year's resolutions I am immediately reminded of that very expensive keychain I carried around for most of that year.

Some members of our church expressed their interest in doing this some time ago, but we are going to make a more concerted effort to train and send out the laypeople of our church to provide home visits for communion, prayer, and fellowship. Our Financial Health:We are Truly Blessed

Back in early November, I presented an endof-year expense plan to the Finance Committee, projecting what our worship giving would be on December 31st. Once again, I failed to appreciate the incredible generosity of our church family. My estimate was \$162,000, and, praise God, the actual amount was \$168, 285!! Our budget for 2017 was \$150,254, so we exceeded our budget by **over** \$18,000. Our budget for 2018 is \$155,970, so if the Lord continues to inspire your generosity, we should be in good condition to carry out our mission.
