#### **Message From Pastor Brad**

#### **Clean Your Interior**

I've realized in my almost 8 years of preaching regularly and writing articles for the church on a regular basis that there are certain trains of thought I can very easily fall into on a routine basis. As I was about to sit down and use this month's Dove to pick on how most people have abandoned their resolutions by now anyway, I realized that was a path I've already gone down. God used that minor revelation to give me a greater realization about how the world works and how we as the church need to go the other way, all thanks to these pesky resolutions.

I now know why I don't like New Year's resolutions. They're too surface-level and based on us trying to do or act our way into being someone else. It's all about works, and if you're curious about what the Bible says about works take a look at the Book of James and what Jesus said about how to pray. Many people say they're going to eat more of this or less of that, when their goal should be to be a healthier person overall. Many people may say they are going to read more or take a class or something, but imagine if their goal was to be more curious and committed to learning? Maybe you've heard someone say they are going to be more sociable and go out more in the new year, when they are really looking for closer relationships, not simply being around other people.

Being a follower of Christ is first and foremost about interior work. It's what God is most concerned with and we should follow suit. The exterior, for us and how we relate to others, is a byproduct and secondary to what's going on inside of us. I can get a bright new coat of paint put on my van, but that won't change the fact that my engine is

being held together with faith and struggling against more than one problem. The same goes for us.

Skinny you, bigger you, social you, more read you, the you that goes to things or doesn't. If God isn't at work in your heart and changing your life, how you look and where you are doesn't matter. I'm reminded of the story of the rich young ruler, which can be found in Mark 10:17-27. This wealthy young person comes to Christ asking what he needs to do to, "Inherit eternal life" (10:17). Jesus tells the young man to go sell all of his possessions and give the money to the poor. We read that when he heard this, "the man's face fell. He went away sad, because he had great wealth" (10:22). This guy was willing to pay a price to attain this prize of eternal life because he had money to spare.

Thankfully and obviously, Jesus was wise to his game. When the young man was confronted with Jesus' challenge to change who he was, and not just make an easy sacrifice, he left empty handed. In this new year, I do hope we all continue to strive for greater health and discipline in our physical, spiritual, mental, and emotional lives individually and as a church. Doing is important, but we are called not only to do and say like Christ, but to take on the likeness of Christ in all our ways. It's more than a resolution, it's a covenant we've made and in God's mercy, He lets us renew it often and turn to Him for everything we need to get there. May we all be God's obedient children ready to receive the blessings the Lord has in store for us this year.

# Our Financial Health: ...We Are Truly Blessed

God has truly blessed us this year. As of December 31, worship giving is more than \$11,000 greater than our budget estimate for 2018, which was \$155,970. This is a wonderful tribute to a dedicated and generous church family.

Our General Fund balance at the end of December was almost \$41,000, and as planned, an initial supplemental payment of \$4,000 was paid against the Wesley Hall mortgage, leaving a final General Fund balance of \$36,906.

We still believe it would be prudent to go into 2019, with a general fund balance of between \$25,000 and \$30,000. The Finance Committee will be meeting in early January to consider additional actions to further reduce our mortgage.

We are thankful for the generosity of all of our church family who are going the extra mile to remove our indebtedness. Whereas we had predicted a mortgage balance at the end of 2018 of around \$95,000, we are clearly well ahead of that estimate.

Our plan for reaching mortgage payoff by January 2021 will have two phases:

- For 2019, we will encourage giving for mortgage reduction over and above your usual worship giving amount, and convey our progress with weekly/monthly updates.
- We will revisit the plan in November 2019, and if it does not look like we will make the payoff target, we will consider a pledge drive for the remainder of the period.

## **Trustees Report**

Sanctuary Security: At the last Administrative Council meeting, we started a discussion about how, and when, and where we should provide protection for persons who are within our facilities if an armed intruder attempts to enter and threaten their lives. At this time, the only initiative we are pursuing is training for reaction to an armed intruder. Other initiatives may be considered in the future.

<u>Audio System:</u> Earlier this year, we acquired new microphones, which seem to be working quite well. We will be requesting a proposal to consider improvements to other components of the audio system in 2019.

Attic Fans, Street Lights: We will be requesting a proposal to replace attic fans in the sanctuary, and add an additional street light to the parking lot.
