"Why do bad things happen to good people?" <u>OR</u>

"Why does God let bad things happen to good people?

Have you ever been asked one or both of these questions before? Have you ever been the one asking? Or even asked yourself? I've been the asker and recipient several times over to both questions. Usually the question never leaves my mind, but there have been rare occasions when I have asked a family member, friend, or mentor. You know what the common thread is, what happens every time regardless of who is involved or how? An unsatisfying answer. I have honestly never heard someone give an answer to this issue that made me feel God's strength, love, control, and compassion equally and deeply across the board. You have to favor one side, God as strong and in control or God as loving and compassionate, in order to try and justify things.

Why do we want to know why? Is there comfort in the facts or details? Imagine if God somehow sat you down and somehow explained to you all the reasons and rationale for every tragedy and failure in your life. That would be the worst day of my life. There's no spreading it out or sugarcoating things to make it any better. Knowing the why of terrible things won't bring change or healing, so what's to be done with them? I like how, far better than why. I know I am excellent at dwelling on the past, whether I somehow brought it on myself or something horrible just happened. What I need is a next step or two, to have God give me some kind of push to get myself going again. This doesn't excuse trials and tribulations or the long-term pain that they can bring.

In my mind, this illustrates the reality of life and how willing God is to be present in our right now, even when things are so bad that no one else is able to stand that close to us. In this Lenten season of preparation, it's important for us to acknowledge the burdens and scars we carry around with us from the world we live in. They happened, they've left their mark, but the good news is that they don't define us or our story. They certainly are a part of it, but they ultimately point to the redemptive work of God's grace and how needed it is in our life. It points to God's grace in our life so that, if we let it and answer the call, our lives can point to the presence of God in this world for others also. That is the ultimate how at work here and where our next steps from tragedy can lead to. As Christ reaches out to all of His children with His pierced hands out of love, we can reach to those in need around us with hands and hearts that have weathered so much because of who God is and wants to be for us all. May we all strive to reach as far and wide as our savior who showed divine strength through human weakness and brought the joy of everlasting life from the depth of grief and loss.

The Upper Room Disciplines 2018: A Book of Daily Devotions

This is a collection of daily devotional readings, which are relatively short, and daily prayers for the whole year. This book also includes a list of the lectionary readings for the year, a guide to daily prayer, and examples of prayers to use throughout your day.

A Disciple's Journal 2018: A Guide for Daily Prayer, Bible Reading, and Discipleship by Steven W. Manskar

This book is written and edited by a United Methodist pastor who works for our denomination's Discipleship Ministries. He is also an expert on covenant discipleship, which is a small group ministry and guide for individual faith based on how Wesley practiced and organized the early Methodist movement. This book provides Scripture readings for every day, selections from John Wesley's writings, hymns from Charles Wesley, individual prayers, and a variety of articles and guides on Methodism, covenant discipleship, and Methodist doctrine. Our Financial Health???

Well, we are two months into 2018, and I thought it would be productive to talk about where we stand financially.

We ended 2017 on a positive note, with our actual worship giving exceeding the amount budgeted by over \$18,000. This included a special \$5,000 donation to fund the sanctuary ramp improvements.

Unfortunately, at the end of February, our worship giving is almost \$3,900 under budget, and our disbursements are almost \$1,100 over our worship giving receipts. Without going into the various reasons causing this situation, I would urge you do the following:

- Pray for our church and church family, thanking the Lord for His many blessings, and asking for His guidance for the future.
- Join the ongoing effort to reach out to nearby communities, to make them aware of opportunities we offer for worship and fellowship.
- Consider your worship giving. Although we do not have a pledge campaign, consider your giving as a pledge to the Lord, keeping up with your commitment, and where possible, increasing it.

Waste material should be placed in large trash containers - one located outside the rear door of the sanctuary and one at the ramp door to Wesley Hall. We are also planning the installation of rain gutters over the handicapped ramp.

The sanctuary oil furnace was inspected last week, and found to be in satisfactory condition, considering it is more than 15 years old.

As always, we will be considering ways to improve the comfort and safety of our church family.
