Pastor Brads Message

Reflections on the Special General Conference

As many of you are probably aware, the global gathering of our denomination that met in St. Louis concluded its business at 6:30 PM our time on Tuesday night. This concluded four days of meetings which consisted of a day of prayer, a day of setting priorities, a day of functioning as the Legislative Committee to decide what was going to be brought to a vote, and finally voting on the last day. There were a few surprising events along the way, starting with how the voting delegates prioritized what was to be discussed. After the body voted, legislation relating to clergy pensions came out on top. This was considered first, even above the primary plans that came through the Commission on a Way Forward, and petitions for providing a means for congregations to amicably leave the denomination. Second to pensions were two petitions about disaffiliation, followed by the Traditional Plan, and then the One Church Plan. Both the Connectional Conference Plan and the Simple Plan ranked far lower on the list.

The surprise to many in the legislative session was that the One Church Plan, which was endorsed by the Council of Bishops, failed to get enough votes to be considered for a final vote in the last day of the conference. The Traditional Plan was voted through the Legislative Session, and after much discussion in the Plenary Session was ultimately approved by the General Conference after a final vote. The legislative session addressed legislation related to clergy pensions and voted through two petitions providing means for congregations to leave the denomination quickly and without much legal entanglements. The Simple Plan was discussed after the One Church Plan, but it too was vetoed by the body. After all of this was discussed, a motion to vote on the rest of the legislation as one was approved and led to everything else being voted down in one action.

During the Plenary Session of General Conference on the last day there was a great deal of discussion, debate, public demonstrations, and even heartache and pain among those present. The One Church Plan was brought up for consideration as a minority report only to be voted down again. After a prolonged debate, including discussing several amendments and passing a view, the Traditional Plan was approved as amended by the body. One of the plans for disaffiliation was also approved by the General Conference delegates. After the Traditional Plan was approved, many LGBT persons and their supporters began to gather in worship, prayer, and in silent demonstration on the floor of the conference. The conference ended with another action that brought the rest of the business of the conference to one vote, and the body decided to vote everything else out of consideration at once.

Looking at the future of our denomination right now, more things are up in the air than certain. The Traditional Plan as it was approved contained several petitions that were already deemed unconstitutional by the Judicial Council, our denomination's Supreme Court, before the vote. At their next meeting at the end of April it appears the Council will have to address the Traditional Plan again. The petition that was approved by the conference to allow congregations to leave the denomination was also deemed unconstitutional by the Judicial Council because it infringed on the rights of annual conferences to manage the status of congregations, including those that leave.

At the end of General Conference, representatives of the Western Jurisdiction, which consecrated a bishop who is an open and married lesbian, made a statement that they were going to continue being a church for all people and continue to be in ministry as their faith and consciences dictated. They also invited anyone interested into a discussion about the future of the United Methodist Church, including their relationship with the denomination. The Wesleyan Covenant Association, a conservative coalition of UMC clergy, laity, and churches from across the denomination, held a meeting right after General Conference to discuss their plans as a group. There are several other gatherings being planned across our denomination by annual conferences and other key leaders to discern what the future of United Methodism is in our country and the world.

This is my first attempt at recounting all of the facts and key events so far, but there will be time for us to meet and share as a congregation later this month after Bishop Johnson holds her town halls about all of this and more information comes out about the implications of all of this. In this time if anyone needs to talk or meet with me in person, through phone, e-mail, for any reason related to all of this, please don't hesitate to contact me, or schedule a meeting. Throughout the world, countless people are seeing headlines about our denomination and seeing limited views of all of this and what it means. I encourage you to be in prayer for our denomination and the ministry of our local church, so that we can continue to live out God's love and grace for ourselves and those around us in meaningful ways.

Trustees Report

<u>Sanctuary Security</u>: We have engaged local law enforcement to arrange for training for reaction to an armed intruder. When the date and time are arranged, we will invite all who are interested to attend. Other initiatives may be considered in the future.

Sanctuary Audio System: We have awarded a contract to provide the system upgrade. Installation will occur on March 12, 2019, with testing and training to be completed prior to the Living Last Supper performance on April 18, 2019

<u>Parking Lot Street Lights:</u> We have awarded a contract to add an additional street light to the parking lot. Siting of the light will take place within the next week.

Sanctuary Projection System: A demonstration of a large-screen TV system for the sanctuary was held at St. Georges UMC, with encouraging results, given the age of that system. However, due to the cost of the system (~\$7,000) the Trustees voted to put this upgrade on hold until later in the year, when our financial situation is more clearly defined.
