Message From Pastor Brad

I often find myself thinking about what is taken seriously throughout most of Christianity today and how much it lines up with what we are told to do through the Gospels. What have you experienced as the most serious commitments or calls to action in the church? What has been expressed to you as a non-negotiable or something that is to be held in the highest esteem? There are certainly some universal tenants of the faith that we all share throughout the different branches of Christianity, but then you also find the unique quirks and specific doctrines found in different communities and denominations. I don't know about you, but I feel like we spend a lot of time trying to solve problems and fight the fights we feel like we need to in the world. In different times and seasons there is a place and need for both, but lately I've wondered how much we exceed and infringe on where God needs to lead.

I don't think this typically happens out of any malicious or selfish place of ill-will. I think a lot of us are very good at not knowing when to stop. As you may imagine, God in God's infinite wisdom and mercy gave us as solution to this a long time ago because it's not a recent phenomenon. It's the Sabbath. Out of all the things I can think of that are spoken or treated with great severity in the church, I personally have never experienced the Sabbath in that way. Which is a shame, because in Exodus 31:14 we are told to, "Observe the Sabbath, because it is holy to you. Anyone who desecrates it is to be put to death; those who do any work on that day must be cut off from their people" (NIV). A lot of folks, me included, often run the risk of trivializing the Sabbath as a spiritualized day off because we struggle with giving up our compulsion to always be doing, working, or acting.

I encourage you to explore how you can take the Sabbath more seriously and truly make it an act

of worship as you live out your faith. To stop, to rest, is one of the most powerful sacrifices we can make to God in our culture where time is treated as the greatest commodity. Paul says in Romans 12:1 "I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship" (NIV). Although I don't know anything about cars, I know what it's like to drive one into the ground verses treating it with more respect and care. Admittedly, I've felt a little driven into the ground lately, so this message is for me more than anyone else. I'm finishing this up before I take an out of character two days off in the middle of the week to spend time with my family and be solely focused on them. I need it, they need it, we need it, and I believe God encourages it so that I can come back refreshed and offer more to the Lord than what my stress and tiredness usually allows.

Don't drive yourself in the ground just because that's how we've been trained and that's how the world seemingly works. Take care of yourself as an act of worship, knowing that God is taking care of the rest.

Sanctuary Power Failure: We have filed a claim with our insurance company for reimbursement of repair costs as appropriate.

Facility Security: Our Security Team (Brice Cropper, Tom Maly, and Joe Skinner) provided information on use of pepper spray as a deterrent to an intruder. Before endorsing, Trustees requested, and the team provided information on products, and training in the use of this material. Trustees are evaluating this information.

Sanctuary Projection System: It was agreed that this upgrade from a projection system to a video system should be revisited at a later date when our financial situation is more clearly defined.
