Message From Pastor Brad

You Can't Rush the Crops

"But the landowner said, No, because if you gather the weeds, you'll pull up the wheat along with them. Let both grow side by side until the harvest. And at harvest time I'll say to the harvesters, First gather the weeds and tie them together in bundles to be burned. But bring the wheat into my barn." -Matthew 13:29-30 (CEB)

At any point in your professional life, were you ever faced with any abstract questions about your life? A common one is something to the effect of, "Where do you see yourself in 5 (or 10) years from now"? This kind of thinking has been on my mind because every summer I get to answer some questions like that in the form I get to fill out for my annual supervisory interview with the District Superintendent. I must admit, these usually aren't my favorite things to dwell upon, but God has done a wondrous thing by combining this kind of broad thinking with Jesus' parable about the wheat and the weeds. This parable has stuck with me and I keep coming back to what it means to be part of the wheat.

In the past, whenever I had come across this parable I couldn't help but focus on the ending. That is a profound message and, depending on where you stand with the Lord, either a powerful affirmation or a serious warning. I've learned to value the image of planting and crops even more because they are things that cannot be rushed. You can't rush to the end, as I often have, because there is a lot of work, care, and waiting that comes before the harvest. In Jesus' explanation of this parable we as followers of Christ are identified as the wheat, and the "followers of the evil one" are the weeds (13:38). Be that as it may, the one who planted the good seeds, which Christ identifies as the Son of Man in verse 37, declares that the wheat and the weeds are going to grow up together.

In the parable, the Master tells his servants, after they ask if the weeds should be pulled up, to let them be because it would put the wheat at risk. What does that say to you about how much God loves and values us? Mercy is chosen over judgment in that moment so that the harvest can be as full as possible without any casualties. At the end of the parable Jesus says that there are going to still be some weeds that will be tossed into the fire, but the rest of the harvest will be brought into the storehouse. To see the hope in this we must temporarily abandon the plant imagery, because we all know a weed can't be turned into something beautiful or beneficial no matter how much love and care is put into it. But isn't that exactly what Christ offers and does for every one of us?

Some of us may have lived like a weed, not doing much good for ourselves or others. Or maybe we were part of the crop, we knew Christ and believed, but maybe we weren't bearing all the fruit we could. Regardless of then, we can all claim our place in the wondrous harvest to come and grow into something beyond our wildest hopes and dreams thanks to the redemption and salvation that can only come from Christ. The harvest is coming, we don't know when and we certainly can't rush it along, but we can all take the time we have left to deepen our roots in the Lord, grow into the Spirit, and hopefully lead some weeds into being transformed by Christ along the way.

Local UM Churches Working Together in Mission

Last Spring our District Superintendent organized the churches of the Dover District into 9 missional connector groups. Our group includes Union Wesley UMC, St. George's UMC, Mariner's Bethel UMC, St. Matthew's By the Sea, Bayside Chapel, Zion UMC in Roxana, Sound UMC, Salem UMC, Zion UMC in Selbyville, and Frankford UMC. The pastors of these churches have been meeting monthly for roughly the last six months, with Pastor Brad and Pastor Blair Hall tasked by the Superintendent to lead the group.

Two of the primary goals of this approach is to build relationships between churches overall, but to also engage in a shared mission in the community. Our group has decided to support the ministerium's men's homeless shelter as our mission for the foreseeable future. What we are going to do, as the United Methodist Churches of our area, is put together what's called a Blessing Bag for shelter guests in the daytime.

This is a bag of food, snacks, and a drink for during the day while the shelter is closed. Millville UMC has been tasked with supplying breakfast bars for these bags. They can be any brand or kind but need to be full sized bars. Since residents will get these bags every day, we need to put together 200 bags to cover the whole season. That means our church needs to collect 200 breakfast bars before our Church Conference on November 23rd, when all our churches will pack these bags for the shelter. Donations can be brought to the sanctuary on Sunday morning or left in Wesley Hall during the week, but please make sure they are labeled as for the shelter. Thank you for your generosity.

Trustees Report

Sanctuary Power Failure: On August 15, the electrical power to the sanctuary was corrupted by damage to the wires from the power company transformer to our building. At this time, everything is back on line except one hearing assist device, the irrigation system controller, and some lights above the choir loft. We have notified our insurance company and will file a claim for reimbursement of repair costs as appropriate.

Facility Security: Our Security Team (Brice Cropper, Tom Maly, and Joe Skinner) made a presentation to the Trustees and Administrative Council outlining near-term and future actions they believe provides an appropriate level of protection against a possible attack on our congregation. Details will be made available upon request.

Sanctuary Projection System: It was agreed that this upgrade from a projection system to a video system should be revisited at a later date when our financial situation is more clearly defined.

Sanctuary Attic Fans: This repair is still under consideration.
