Message From Pastor Brad

"Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind."" – Matthew 22:37

Welcome back! Happy Fall! Now that we are all done hosting, traveling, and all the other fun that comes with summer we can get to some work as the Body of Christ. Take whatever time you need to recover, because this note is only the beginning of what you are going to hear and read from me for this season. It all starts with the verse from Matthew above, which has admittedly been stuck in my head and heart for at least the last month. How do you feel after reading it? Take a minute to really read it once or twice and let it sit with you. How would you feel if you applied it to your own life? Take another minute to pray and dwell on this verse and how you measure up to it. I hope you don't read it as an indictment, but I also honestly hope you don't give yourself an A+ and move right along. If you're anything like me, I hope you take this verse as a means of freedom and motivation.

In the Gospel of Matthew Jesus refers to this passage as the greatest commandment in the Law, as it is originally found in Deuteronomy 6. It is the greatest commandment, but also sounds a bit on the impossible side. That's not to say that I, or many people, don't bring our heart, soul, and mind into our faith, but how do we engage it with ourselves and others. It's that pesky word "all" that throws everything awry. All our heart? All our soul? All our mind? One or more of those things can feel like a pretty tall order on any given day of the week. Remember though, we are reading this with freedom and motivation. The freedom comes by way of acknowledging that we will never hit this mark on our own. God knows that, but God has also given us untold days, blessings, people and supports to use every moment to try. That's where the motivation comes in. We're not meant to accept the inevitability of this and hope for the best.

God has set the goal, the course, and in the Lord's marvelous grace left us not to our own means to get there. Our job is to honestly admit to where we are today, prayerfully discern the next step God has set before us, and then let the Holy Spirit lead the way. If we do that, over and over again and day after day, we don't know what we will be or what we will achieve. What we can have is assurance that we've given all we can to the Lord and that God has used it to make the Kingdom more alive in us and all the people and places we've been. May we all move honestly in faith in pursuit of all that can be with God.

Trustees Report

Sanctuary Power Failure: On August 15, the electrical power to the sanctuary was corrupted by damage to the wires from the power company transformer to our building, due to abrasion from one of our trees. The result was a power surge that caused some of our systems to fail. At this time, everything except the oil furnace is back on line. We have notified our insurance company and will file a claim for costs as appropriate.

Facility Security: The Response to Active Shooter presentation to the church was conducted on July 28th. Our Security team now includes Brice Cropper, Tom Maly, and Joe Skinner. The team will present a proposal to enhance facility security to the Trustees on September 9th and to the Administrative Council the following week.

Sanctuary Projection System: This upgrade is on hold until later in the year, when our financial situation is more clearly defined.

Sanctuary Attic Fans: This repair is still under consideration.
