Message From Pastor Brad

Not Yet

Around this time of year for at least the last several years that I can remember, when all things Christmas begin to appear everywhere, something else catches momentum in a lot of Christian circles. Have you ever been faced with talk about the “War on Christmas”? Countless people, churches, and other organizations have used this phrase as a rallying cry against the overwhelming secularization of Christmas in our world.

It is true that we live in a culture where countless people and families celebrate this holiday with no mention or awareness of Christ. Kids and youth can spend their whole adolescence thinking Santa Claus is the reason for this season. The greatest gift this world has even been given, Jesus Christ, is overshadowed by piles and piles of stuff. I would say these are all valid points and issues we need to deal with individually and with others. Before you take up the struggle against any war on Christmas, I have one question for you. What about Advent? Do we care enough about Advent to put up a fight for it and make it more a part of our lives?

We as followers of Christ, those who know His story and have inherited the faith and practices of generations of believers before us, can do more with the season of Advent. Christmas is coming, we all know, but we are blessed to have a whole season in the church beforehand to prepare ourselves to more fully receive the coming Messiah. In the first chapter of Luke’s Gospel we read about a powerful moment between Mary, Elizabeth, and the not yet born John. Verse 41 says that when, “Elizabeth heard Mary’s greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit” (NIV). Matthew 3:2 introduces us to the

grown-up John the Baptist who proclaimed this message, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near” (NIV). Through his ministry John fulfilled the words of Isaiah 40:3 that describes, “A voice of one calling: “In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God” (NIV). I don’t know about you, but I could certainly do more of this in my life.

Before Jesus there was John. Before Christ offered Himself, humanity was led into repentance. Advent calls us into a time of holy preparation before we approach the manger and the star. May we take the time God has set before and do the work in ourselves and with each other He is enabling us to do so that we may fully join in with all heaven and nature singing in praise. Christmas is coming, but until then I wish you all a blessed and meaningful Advent.

Home Communion & Visitations

Pastor Brad is putting out an open invitation to submit names for anyone who would like to receive communion at home, but is unable to attend our church or any church. They do not have to be a member of our church or any other congregation to receive communion where they are. This can include friends, family members, or neighbors who are homebound or at a local rehabilitation or nursing home center. If there is a person in your life who has indicated they would appreciate this kind of visit, please submit their full name, address, phone number, and any other contact information to the church through e-mail or a written note. Also, please indicate whether they would like a layperson to visit them, only the pastor, or if either one would be okay.

It is Pastor Brad’s hope and vision to expand the caring and visitation ministries of our church beyond him to include as many laypeople from our church as are willing. Some members of our church expressed their interest in doing this some time ago, but we are going to make a more concerted effort to train and send out the laypeople of our church to provide home visits for communion, prayer, and fellowship. If you feel led to participate in this ministry, please let Pastor Brad know by e-mail or written note.

Our Financial Health:Praise God

With one month to go in our budget year....wow! Your generosity is overwhelming. After the third Sunday in November, the margin between what we budgeted for worship giving and actual giving is \$10,952. Furthermore, at the end of October, the difference between our worship giving and actual expenses is around \$11,800.

That being said, the finance committee has recommended, and the administrative council approved, putting an additional \$4,000 against the Wesley Hall mortgage, and increasing our capital reserve fund by \$2,000. Also, we will start work on replacing the splintered railings on the handicapped ramp to the sanctuary. We had planned that project, but were holding off to see how are financial situation looked.

The Administrative Council approved a 2018 budget of \$155,780. This budget is about 4% greater than 2017, and represents the confidence the council has in your continued generosity. Copies of the budget are available at the rear of the sanctuary for your information. Please contact me with any questions you may have regarding our finances.

What's happening with the Directories?

The last of the portraits were taken on October 29th by Lifetouch. I submitted the final directory on November 2nd. Lifetouch was searching for a missing church member, but together we found their photo on November 9th. It takes 10-15 business days to get a proof of the directory from Lifetouch. The proof for the directory is being mailed out on November 30th, so I have asked them to overnight it to me. After I give approval, it will take them 10-15 business days to produce then ship! We just may have them by Christmas!

Please keep this in mind:

1. Church may submit **photos of not-available members who are in nursing homes, home-bound, away at college or the military**, and they also receive a copy of the directory. We are allowed to submit photos that fall into this category. We can submit up to 10 of these for free, and then they are \$10 each after that.
2. If MUMC Members or Attendees **chose NOT to be photographed**, their contact information will still be in the roster. The roster is the complete listing and not just people photographed. Being in the roster but not photographed will not qualify for a free copy of the printed directory. **Only those who are photographed by Lifetouch and those listed will get a free directory.** A directory can be purchased for \$ 10.00.
3. Some of you have already given me money towards your directory -- thank you. If you haven't paid, please wait until the directories

are ready for distribution and pay me then. I have placed and paid for the additional directories for MUMC Members or Attendees. Do not place the money into the offering. This is on my credit card – not the church's card.
