MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BRAD

It's What You Don't Do

“But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.” – Galatians 5:22-23, NIV

As we near the end of this journey through the Fruit of the Spirit I must admit that I was not overly excited to write about gentleness. It's a concept that I have mixed feelings about, especially as it is often related to Christianity. I've come across many folks, too many I would say, who believe that following Christ means that you can never take a stand or take actions which may lead to some people being inconvenience or challenged.

I struggle against this personally because I feel like it can easily lead to people and groups being walked all over by the more outspoken and strong-willed. This can take all kinds of forms and be seen in all kinds of situations. In all my study of Scripture and Jesus' teachings I have never read anything that says that in order to follow Christ you have to turn yourself into a doormat. There is Luke 9:23 though, which has Jesus saying, “All who want to come after me must say no to themselves, take up their cross daily, and follow me” (CEB). So how do we get from gentleness to sacrifice?

In reading for this letter, I was given the gift of the true meaning of biblical gentleness which has enabled me to reclaim the Word as something I can be comfortable with and stand behind. Gentleness as part of the Fruit of the Spirit isn't about any kind of weakness or rolling over, it's about restraint and sacrificial living. It reminds me of one of my favorite chapters in the Bible, 1 Corinthians 8. The chapter is focused on meat sacrificed to false gods, but what it's really saying about our priorities and

how we are meant to live together is pretty remarkable to me.

Early in the chapter are the first two verses I ever memorized after I found Christ in college because of how much they comforted me and spoke to my needs. In 1 Corinthians 8:1-3 Paul says, “We know that “We all possess knowledge.” But knowledge puffs up while love builds up. Those who think they know something do not yet know as they ought to know. But whoever loves God is known by God” (NIV). There's another translation of verse 3 that I feel is equally profound which says, “But whoever loves truly knows” (NIV). So what do all of these verses say about the gentleness Paul is talking about in his letter to the Galatians?

Gentleness in this context is about being so devoted to God and so committed to your brothers and sisters in Christ that you are willing to dictate your own life around their needs more than your own. Being obedient and serving God is a pretty familiar concept, even to the point of not doing things you used to do. What about your family in Christ though? Have you ever thought about changing what you do, even limiting some things so that you can better love and serve those around you? That's what I believe biblical gentleness is, taking up your cross for Christ AND those around you. I encourage you to turn to the Lord in deeper commitment so that He can make room in you for the gentleness and grace of God to be shared with others in clear and loving ways.

OUR FINANCIAL HEALTH IS
.....RECOVERING (PRAISE GOD!!)

Well, one month ago, I reported to you that I was somewhat concerned about our financial health. You recall our worship giving was under budget by about \$5,000, and our expenses were \$5,200 more than our worship giving. Oh ME of little faith.

I know I prayed for God's direction, and I am sure many of our church family did the same. Do you know what happened? Our very generous church family responded to God's call by making worship giving for the month of April the BEST IN CHURCH HISTORY!!! With giving for that month at \$18,799.05, we are now about even with our budgeted estimate for the end of April.

However, one month does not define a trend, and we recognize that giving for the month could have been influenced by a number of factors, such as "catch-up" donations by those who were out of town earlier in the year. For that reason, we will continue to make prudent decisions on various non-recurring spending initiatives, delaying some actions until we are assured that our budget is viable. We are cautiously optimistic that the trend will continue.

God has sent some new faces to our worship services, and we are prayerful that they will make the "Welcome Church" their church home. We will continue outreach initiatives described in earlier editions of the Dove, including making surrounding communities aware of opportunities for worship and fellowship offered by our church. Also, we will make every effort to invite neighbors, friends, and recent acquaintances to worship, and fellowship events such as our pot-luck dinners, sing-alongs, picnics, special events, etc.

The strength of our church resides in the love we have for our Lord and for each other, and not in our balance sheet. Please continue to pray for His direction in all things as we strive to make our church a spiritual lighthouse in our effort to bring disciples to Christ.
