### **Message From Pastor Brad**

Hello Friends,

A year ago I was asked to be the chairperson of the Conference Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry for our annual conference. I wanted to share with you all a letter I wrote for our conference newsletter about what this board does and why it is so important to me. This board's mission can be described with the words connecting, advocating, and supporting. The first word, connecting, is very important because it describes our board's place in the mission statement of the Peninsula Delaware Annual Conference which is cultivating communities through our CALL: Connecting, Acting, Leading, and Loving. This connecting happens with college students to campus ministries and local churches, churches to campus ministries, and campus ministries to the annual conference. Campus ministry is our shared ministry because it continues the work of discipleship that begins early in a young person's life in the church and helps bring spiritual growth to college students as they find a new church or religious community for themselves.

Between late August and early September countless new and returning students have moved into college dormitories or nearby housing to start or continue their journey through higher education. They will be presented with opportunities to learn and grow intellectually in the classroom and through their studies. Outside of the classroom they will be challenged to grow as a person as they are presented with new ideas, new freedoms, and an introduction to the world beyond wherever they grew up. This is certainly a wonderful and exciting time, but it can also be confusing and overwhelming. It is so incredibly necessary to provide these students with a means to stay grounded in faith. Campus ministry can provide them with a community of peers and mentors to

help navigate through all of this, regardless of their faith upbringing.

From early on in life through high school, church was a given for me because we went as a family and did many things in church as a family. It wasn't mandatory, but I never saw it as optional because of how much a part of our lives it was. As you may imagine, that all changed in college. All of a sudden there's no one waking you up for church or making sure you get there on time. You're on your own and going to a new church full of new people that don't know anything about you. That can be a very scary and intimidating thing. The only thing that saw me through that transition and all its inherent struggles was a campus ministry. It provided students who were in a similar place in life to me and going through the same struggles. I was disciplined by mentors, upperclassmen and pastors, who could provide me with wisdom learned from their own lives.

If you have any young people in your church, or that you know in any capacity, who are starting or going back to college please do everything you can do get them connected with a local Wesley Foundation, the United Methodist Campus Ministry, and a local congregation. If you have any questions or need help with these please e-mail me or anyone on our board and we will help you make those connections. Within our conference we have a Wesley Foundation or United Methodist campus ministry at the University of Delaware, Delaware State University, Salisbury University, and the University of Maryland Eastern Shore. A person doesn't have to be going to one of these schools for us to help get them connected, they're just the closest ones.

A home congregation's work doesn't end with making sure a student has a spiritual

community wherever they are going to college. You are certainly sending these college students away with God's blessings and entrusting their spiritual care to others, but that connection to home always remains. Do everything you can to regularly remind these young people that their home church is thinking about them and praying for them. Send them messages via e-mail, telephone, Facebook, or even a card to their new address. Care packages and food of any kind is always welcome! To be reminded that although they are out on their own, but that they are NOT alone is a profoundly comforting message.

One of the bigger tasks that the Conference Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry has is the funding, administering of, and awarding of three conference scholarships. We also review applications and designate winners for two financial awards through the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry. Our conference scholarships include a merit based award, a need based award, and a scholarship for members of a Wesley Foundation. Last year the CBHECM awarded three \$500 scholarships, but we are looking to do more for our students as attaining a degree keeps getting more expensive.

Our hope is to begin awarding \$1000 scholarships as soon as possible, but that requires the help of all the churches and members of our conference. I would ask you all to prayerfully consider giving to our Pen-Del Scholarship Fund so that we can grow in our ability to support those who are answering God's call to serve in a variety of careers. In all of this I am reminded of a familiar passage from Isaiah, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland" (43:19, NIV). This is truly a season of new things, and by us working together in our connected ministry we can help provide a way through for our college students facing so much temptation and anxiety and provide them with the joy and peace of Jesus. May we serve and share as Christ's one church working together!

**Our Financial Health:**  
**Still Doing OK, but.....**

We are three quarters of the way through our  
budget year, and we are still doing OK. The margin  
between what we budgeted for worship giving and  
actual giving is starting to trend down. Our worship  
giving still exceeds our budget estimate by about  
\$5,300, and our expenses are less than our budgeted  
amount by about \$2,745. All that to say that the  
difference between worship giving and outlays is  
decreasing.

The Administrative Council approved a  
2018 budget of \$155,780. This budget is about 4%  
greater than 2017, and represents the confidence the  
council has in your continued generosity. The  
budget will be presented at the church conference

on October 10<sup>th</sup>, and copies will be available at the  
rear of the sanctuary for your review prior to the  
conference. Please contact me with any questions
