Message From Pastor Brad

Still Standing

What does the word strength mean to you? What does it look like? A favorite movie of Brynn and Emma's is a recent animated feature called "Sing!", which was actually the first one they ever saw in a theater. It's about the owner of a performance theater who has dreams of success that have never panned out. Every performance he has staged has been a failure to the point that he can't pay his employees and the bank is on the brink of repossessing the place. As a last-ditch effort, he gathers every dollar and remotely valuable possession he has for a prize for a singing competition. He figures that everyone loves singing contests, like American Idol, so it will turn everything around and save his theater.

What does a cartoon with talking animals have to do with strength? Well, actually quite a lot. As you may imagine, things don't turn out too well for this theater owner, who happens to be a koala bear. A large part of his drive to save his theater comes from the fact that his father took him to see a performance there when he was very young. That experience totally captured the kid's imagination and became the focus of his life. So much so, that his dad worked every day of his life so that he could help the son buy the place. Unfortunately, in the preparation for this singing competition the theater owner deals with setback after setback, getting knocked down again and again, and pulling every desperate move that he can until things come crumbling down around him.

Literally, the theater gets flooded and years of DIY repairs cause the place to come down. You

dreams, and he does what most people would do in that situation. He begins to weep as he collects what personal things he can salvage and then he gives up.

Of course, the movie doesn't end there. The theater owner is saved by the contestants of the singing competition because he believed so much in it, in them, and in the theater that they couldn't help but be consumed with it all themselves. The movie is ultimately about strength, but not of the individual. It's about the strength we can have when we come together and live for something beyond ourselves.

Have you ever felt not strong before? You may have felt that way for an hour, a day, a few weeks, or even a year. Why? Because we think of strong as being forceful, either physically or mentally. We think of action heroes, those with social influence, or someone who can impose their will on others with whatever power they know they have. Do you think Jesus displayed strength? How? He didn't force His will on others, He invited people. Although Jesus did flip some tables, He didn't kick down doors and take names. When not only His life was on the line, but the fate of all people and creation, Jesus displayed the greatest strength in the most surprising of ways. He withstood. He endured. He took the worst we could do because He was standing, stumbling, crawling, and eventually hanging because Jesus lived, died, and rose again for a dream beyond all of us.

The greatest victory was won by what the world would call weakness and defeat. Think about that the next time you feel without power, or somehow unworthy. In 2 Corinthians 4:8-9 it says,

“We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed” (NIV). We can definitely follow Christ and live into His likeness when things are going great, or just plain normal. I believe we can so very much know the presence, strength, grace, and love of our Lord when it feels like the whole world is heaping it on and the only reason we are standing or even surviving today is because He is the only thing keeping us up. This note is called Still Standing because at the end of the movie a young gorilla sings the Elton John song, “I’m Still Standing”. This is after being disowned by his gangster father and losing everything he knew because he didn’t want to get in on the family business. That was his declaration, and may it be ours’, that we are all still standing because of the God who stands with us.

When I look back at our financial condition a year ago, I continue to marvel at the generosity of our church family. As of August 31st, our worship giving is almost \$7,000 greater than our budget for 2018. At this time last year, we were a little over \$5,000. At the end of August, our expenses exceeded our budget by about \$6,300, but this difference is trending down. We have faith that God will continue to provide for our needs.

As you can see above, the sale netted over \$5,800 which was placed against the mortgage principal. **The combination of the yard sale proceeds and special donations had the effect of shortening our payoff period by over a year!!**

We are still considering ways to have the mortgage paid off by the time the current note comes due in January, 2020, so please consider a special donation using the pew envelopes.
