### **Finance Committee Report**

The finance committee met on June 8<sup>th</sup> and reviewed our income and expenses. Through the end of May, our receipts of \$64,422.66 are \$5,077.34 short of our budgeted goal of \$69,500 for the first 5 months of the year. Though year to date giving has increased, it has not met the budgeted expectations which are needed to meet our new higher expenses. Please pray about this.

In an effort to reduce the interest we are paying to the bank, Mike Matera proposed and the committee approved a motion to offer promissory notes to members and friends of the congregation. These would be 7 year notes that would pay an annual return of 2% (which is far more than the bank is paying and far less than we are paying the bank). Interest only would be paid on the notes until their redemption date. The minimum to obtain a note would be \$5,000; no maximum has been set, however, we would stop offering the notes once sufficient funds were received to pay off the mortgage.
