OUR FINANCIAL HEALTH ISTROUBLING?

Well, we are now three months into 2017, and I am somewhat concerned about our financial health. Not enough to go to our District Superintendent to plead hardship (at this time), but certainly enough to make you aware of the situation.

As I have stated in the past, this church has shown extraordinary generosity when faced with financial challenges, from taking on a full-time pastor, paying down the old Wesley House mortgage, and growing the building fund to minimize the amount we needed to borrow to build Wesley Hall. So I am prayerfully hopeful that you will rise to this challenge, and support whatever actions are within your means and talent to help overcome our problem.

At the end of March, our worship giving was more than \$5,000 under budget, and our disbursements were almost \$6,000 more than our worship giving receipts. We clearly cannot continue this trend.

Without going into the various reasons causing this situation, which I think are self-evident, I would urge you AGAIN to do the following:

- Pray for our church and church family, thanking the Lord for His many blessings, and asking for His guidance for the future.
- Join the ongoing effort to reach out to nearby communities, to make them aware of opportunities we offer for worship and fellowship.
- Consider your worship giving. Although we do not have a pledge campaign, consider your giving as a pledge to the Lord, keeping up with your commitment, and where possible, increasing it.

The Finance Committee will be meeting in May to consider our situation, and prepare recommendations to the Administrative Council.


LENTEN SOUP & SALAD
