### **Message From Pastor Brad**

#### **Be Wary of Drifting**

There is a tradition throughout Christianity to spend New Year's Eve in church for a special time of worship called a Watch Night service. As with Christmas Eve candlelight services, you start at 11:00 pm and end a little after 12:00 am so that you've ended the year and begun the new one focused on God, instead of the more worldly things many others are focused on that night. Although we don't observe this tradition because like many of you it's a miracle if I stay up until midnight at home, it has been on my mind. This past Sunday we heard from Hebrews chapter 2 in worship and in my study we looked at the beginning of the chapter which has a lot to say about paying attention.

Paul starts Hebrews 2 by warning his audience to, "pay the most careful attention, therefore, to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away" (NIV). In the next three verses Paul brings this point home by laying out all the ways that the Lord shared the message of salvation and gave evidence to it through words, "signs, wonders and various miracles, and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his will" (2:4). This is a message we need to hear today as much as the early church because the temptation to and extreme ease at which we can drift away from the ways of Christ is as real today as it was then.

What are all the ways you can think of that we can allow ourselves to drift? We can be quite subtle and creative at this, doing it by overcomplicating things, shifting our focus, rationalizing, and probably many more ways. So, what is the solution? How can we possibly resist or rise above all these pitfalls that we face throughout

our daily life? As you may imagine, it's quite simple and brings us back to Watch Night. Our only hope is to keep watch for and pay attention to Christ. Every day, every moment, with every fiber of our being. If you're anything like me all it takes is one wayward thought or opening of my mouth and in the blink of an eye, I've messed things up. This doesn't mean we have to live ever vigilant or teeter on being legalistic.

We are blessed to be able to live with and grow into a question that can radically change our lives and brighten the days of those we encounter. In everything, we have the chance to ask ourselves, "How can I please the Lord and share the grace of God with whatever I say, do, or think next?". As we begin a new year individually and as a church it's a wonderful time to renew our focus to this calling and recommit to making the ways of Christ the through line which keeps us anchored in His ways. How can we live our lives grounded in the grace of God and moving in Christ's love? May we find new answers to this every day that remind us of whose we are and point our neighbors toward our living God. New Year's Blessings, Pastor Brad

**Sanctuary Projection System:** This project is under consideration as a 2020 effort.

**Facility Security:**

The Trustees are still waiting for a response from our insurance company on liability coverage for our security volunteers who may use pepper spray. Before endorsing, Trustees requested, and the team provided information on products and training in the use of this material. Trustees are evaluating this information.

We are implementing the procedure that calls for the Sanctuary and Wesley Hall doors to be secured shortly after services/Sunday school start, and reopened just before the service ends. Additional approved actions will be implemented in the near future, including video surveillance of entry doors and parking lot.

**Sanctuary Computer:** Due to recent problems with the current system, the Trustees will be considering replacement with a system capable of supporting advanced applications for hymns, scripture, and other service needs. Rich Spina
